file. This will allow members time to get logged in and grab a pen and paper or cup of coffee before we start at 10AM.







chemicals at the top and the open wound is susceptible to disease. She also spoke of the proper technique to cut the plant, on the diagonal, above the node where growth is desired. She said not to prune in the heat of the summer as moisture is lost through the cut and to prune after blooming, not to prune citrus except to cut out dead wood. Plants adapted to the desert do not need nearly as much water and fertilizer as most think. She also gave pruning demonstrations.

Vice President Eleanor Davis told us

about the "amaryllis," native of South Africa or South America. She relayed the Greek Myth about the flower, gave growing instructions: how to force the bulbs or let them grow naturally, how to feed and — LANDSCAPE cont. on page 85
